2025 Water Managers School -Application Deadline December 31, 2024

The NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES), the NH Water Pollution Control Association (NHWPCA) and the NH Water Works Association (NHWWA) are pleased to announce the next session of the NH Drinking Water & Wastewater Managers School, for 2025. Application to the program is open to drinking water and to wastewater professionals preparing for future management or supervisory positions, as well as current managers and supervisors who wish to improve their management skills. Course topics include municipal and utilities legal concepts, budgeting, personnel management/human resources, communication skills, education and outreach, public

Remembering John Forrestall

With sadness, we learned of the death of John Forrestall who passed away on August 31. John was the former Director of General Services for the City of Concord, and a career-long member of NHWWA – serving as President of the Association 1989 – 1990.

John lived in Concord his entire life, with the exception of his time serving in the US Army. He received a Bachelor of Science in civil engineering from the University of NH, Class of 1967. In 1983 he received a Master of Business Administration from Rivier College.

In 1972 John began a thirty-year career with the City of Concord, holding the positions of Highway Superintendent, Assistant Director of Water Works, Director of Water Works, and finally Director of General Services.

Prior to serving as President of NHWWA, John held the positions of Secretary-Treasurer and Vice-President. He was also a founding member of the Association's Legislative Action Committee, where he served from the inception of the Committee in 1990 until his retirement from the City of Concord. During his career, John was a thoughtful, effective, and sometimes forceful (but always kind) voice in the advocacy of sound and common-sense public drinking water policy.

John loved the outdoors, whether it was hunting, fishing, or working in the yard, he always found contentment in nature, More than anything he enjoyed spending time with his family.

John is survived by his beloved wife Ann, 5 children and 11 grandchildren.

NHWWA appreciates all that John did for the Association, and the NH Public Drinking Water Industry at large. John will be very much missed by all of us in the NH drinking water community who had the great fortune of knowing him.

Legislative Preview

The 2025 Legislative Session is under way and not nearly as busy as it was in 2024. These odd-year legislative sessions are historically quiet, with it being an election year (so a lot of new faces) and during a State budget year. However, there are constantly bills that are being submitted, and we need to watch a little closer as things can move a lot faster. Knowing this, we are currently watching 12 new Legislative Service Requests (LSR's). These have only a title and no text yet. Some of the key ones we are following are:

LSR 2025 - 0049

- * allowing subdivision regulations concerning water supply.
- Sponsor: (Prime) Kat McGhee (Hillsborough District 35)

♦ LSR 2025 − 0182

- * increasing penalties for violations of the shoreland and water quality protection act.
- * Sponsor: (Prime) Rosemarie Rung (Merrimack, Hillsboro District 12)

♦ LSR 2025 - 0001

- * Relative to the transfer of state-owned real property to municipalities.
- * Sponsor: (Prime) Nancy Murphy (Merrimack. Hillsboro District 12)

Things to note so far— NHWWA started tracking only 12 LSR's with title only in November. Historically, there are always a low number of LSR's submitted in a "Budget Year". Along with the new LSR's, NHWWA and the legislative committee will still be following 6 House and 3 Senate pieces of legislation from 2024 that are back on the table for 2025. NHWWA will continue to track 21 Bills for now and probably more as we get closer to January as new legislation comes in!

If you want to stay up to date as we follow this legislation, please join in our legislative membership (download membership application here). The cost of Legislative Membership is determined by the size of the utility. Municipal and private PWS membership is \$0.18 per service connection (ex. Concord has 12,000 services and pays \$2,160 per year). Support memberships (vendors and professional firms) pay \$300 per year. Small Community Water Systems (less than 1000 service connections) are only \$150. One of the best perks you get is that you will receive e-mails on legislation being tracked and updates as the session progresses.

The water then passes through three parallel trains of lead-lag GAC filters to remove PFAS and destroy residual peroxide.

Program Details

The course is expected to begin in March 2025. Training will be conducted one day per month, March through November, on the 3rd Tuesday of each month, with most classes in Concord, NH. In addition to this classroom time, there will also be: a utility exchange where candidates will spend a day with the manager of another water utility; time outside of class involved with preparing presentations; and time outside of class performing outreach promoting water utility/ environmental concepts. Individuals who complete the course will be awarded 70 training contact hours (7.0 CEUs), approved for NH DW and WW operator certification continuing education credit.

Program Cost

There is no cost to apply. For those accepted into the program, tuition is \$750 per person, with full payment due by February 28, 2025. Scholarships may be available through the NHWPCA and NHWWA, please contact NHWWA at info@nhwwa.org or visit www.nhwpca.org to learn more.
